WELCOME BACK

Welcome back to everyone following the summer break. The children are settling in after their summer break and it is lovely to see all the new as well as retuning faces. Please ensure all annual data check forms be amended and returned to the school office as soon as possible.

STAFFING UPDATE

We would like to welcome Ms Shirley Stuart who started with us as class teacher for P3/4. Ms Caro Stockan is our probationer this year and is teaching P2/3. Ms Valerie Eunson has started with us in the nursery covering lunch supervision and some afternoon sessions. Ms Leona Benston has extended her working hours on a temporary basis to cover afternoons in the nursery as well. Mrs Donna Reid is now the other part time teacher in nursery with Ms Helga Moss taking up the same position in St Andrews Primary. Mrs Shona Firth has been appointed to principal teacher of art at Stromness Academy for the session and as such we will have a temporary change of art teacher. This may change over the session as well. We are pleased to have Ms Holly Elson as our PE teacher this session as well as she started working with us last term. We are still in the process of recruiting some temporary support for learning assistants for the session.

CHANGES TO SCHOOL ENTRANCES

Children from P4-7 come in at 9.20am in the morning to enable them to move through the school and get ready for class at 9.30am. Children from P1-3 come in at 9.30am. This also avoids a bottle neck at the school entrance. The old entrance is now used for nursery only as they now start and finish at 9.30am and 3.30pm as well. This has now settled down and is working well.

CHALLENGER BUS

Please be aware that the Challenger Bus will is visiting us this week on Wednesday and Thursday. They will perform a 30-45 minute slot to some classes with stories or biographies relating to notable Christians or stories from the bible. ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICINES

If your child needs to be given medicine in the school, please can you take it in to the school office and fill in one of our pink administration of medicine forms. We are not permitted to administer medicines to children unless one of these forms has been completed.

OUTDOOR PLAYTIMES

Over the summer holidays there have been some developments in the playground including a new activity fence and a huge sand pit. The sand pit is enclosed by the high playground fencing to keep it clear from cats and other pests but allows the rain to wash through it to keep it clean. At all times we try to have children outside for their breaks and to allow this to happen, please ensure that you child comes to school with the appropriate clothing for playing outside. There will be occasional days when the children will be inside for breaks but for the most part they will be outside. If you do not want your child to be outside for any reason, eg illness, then please send a note to their class teacher.

WATER IN SCHOOL

We encourage children to take a water bottle to school - preferably with a sports cap - to enable them to have access to drinking water during the school day. It is useful if your child's name is on the bottle. They can re-fill their bottle at school from the water fountain when they need to.

AUTHORISED/UNAUTHORISIED ABSENCE

Please note that we can only authorise absence for children to be taken out of school during term time in exceptional circumstances. We need to know your reason for taking your child/children out of school so please let us know when you contact us. This enables us to make the best decision in relation to whether the absence is authorised or not and how to code the absence in relation to Scottish Government codes.

BADMINTON

We would like to give you some information on badminton that is coming up, this is open to all age groups from Primary 3 to Secondary 6. There will be trials for the squad training during 3 Sundays starting on Sunday 21st September. All sessions will be held at Picky. Trials times below;
