#### PARENT LETTERS/CONSENTS

At the recent Parent Council meeting we expressed concerns about the amount of work it took for us to get back letters and consents for school excursions. We have to ensure as part of the OIC Excursion Policy that you know about any school excursion that takes place and that you have given your consent for it. When children have not returned the consent slips, we often re-issue a letter, text parents and sometimes then phone parents on the morning of the excursion to seek verbal consent for slips that still have not been returned. This can delay the departure of the excursion for all the children. As you can imagine, this takes a tremendous amount of additional administration time to ensure that we have consent for all children. It would be appreciated if the children can return the slips on the first issue so that we then don't need to do the follow ups to seek consent. In future we will continue to seek consent if needed but we will no longer be phoning for consent on the day of the excursion. If by that time, we do not have consent for an excursion; your child will be left at school and will not take part. In this case, your child would join a different class within the school.

#### ROAD SAFETY - BE SAFE BE SEEN

Our Road Safety Awareness week in January was very successful. We have doubled the number of children wearing Hi-Vis items in every class. Thank you to all families who have been talking about how to travel safely. Hi-Vis items make all the difference, and are available to buy from our school office. They cost £2 for a jacket 80p each for armbands.

The Radio Orkney Facebook page provides updates as well. We will endeavour to keep the school open where at all possible, weather, transport and staffing permitting. If the school is open and the buses do not run, parents can make their own arrangements to get their children to and from school. Equally, parents can choose to keep their children home if they feel it is unsafe for them to be out. Please let us know if you keep your children off due to the weather as part of the usual procedures.

If the school is going to close early parents will be alerted through the school text system and parents/carers are expected to come and collect their children. Children are not released to walk home independently if the conditions are so bad that we have to close the school early.
