In accordance with the Education Department Policy for Absences, I am no longer able to authorise absences for any family holidays unless in exceptional circumstances. I am not allowed to authorise any absence for the following reasons:

- The availability of cheap holidays
- The availability of desired accommodation
- Poor weather experienced during summer holidays
- Holidays which overlap beginning or end of term

Parental difficulty obtaining leave - unless evidence from an employer states that leave cannot be granted during school holidays.

Any time that you child is not in school, all parents have a duty to inform the school why the child is away and when they expect them to return to school.

Thank you so much to everyone who has been busy donating shoeboxes for the The Blythswood Care Shoebox Appeal.

Each class will be creating their own 2. shoebox and have decided to fill for:

Pre-School: girl and boy

Class 1: girl Class 1A: boy Class 1/2: girl

Classes 3 and 3A: 7-8 yr boy and girl

Class 4: 8 yr boy and girl

Classes 5 and 5A: 9-10 yr boy and girl

Class 6: 10 yr

Class 7A: teenage girl

Class 7D: man

Class 7M: 11yrs boy and girl

There is still time to create one yourself (see instructions opposite) and/or donate items for the class boxes. To assist, the list of suggested items is printed again at the bottom of the page.

Instructions:

Find a shoebox. Decide to fill it for a child, a teenager, a man or a woman.

Wrap your box and lid separately so that the lid can be removed without tearing the paper (see diagram below)



- 3. Gather the items and pack them into the box.
- 4. Remember that any goods disallowed by customs will be removed. No foods are pemitted apart from sweets, but no loose sweets or lollies are allowed *Best Before Date : No earlier than July 08
- 5. On the checklist, tick the

- items you have put in your shoebox and note any not on the list.
- cut it out and secure the ticked checklist to the outside of the shoebox lid using sticky tape. Detach the donation envelope as instructed and place inside your shoebox.
- 7. Secure the lid with rubber bands. Custom regulations require Blythswood Care to check the contents of your box
