
Did you know that you can see this newsletter online? Did you know that you can see video podcasts of latest news? Do you want to keep up with Parent Council news? Have you mislaid

# And Finally...

We are looking forward to an exciting term with lots of activities for everyone to join in with.

We recently received the evaluation of the ethos survey that was sent out earlier in the year, many thanks to the parents and children that returned the completed questionnaires (44 families—29% and 114 pupils – 61%), I have collated the results and have highlighted the key responses from each of the groups, they are as follows:-

Pupils say that they:-

feel safe in all areas of the school, get on well with staff, are listened to and their opinions matter, know what to do if they are bullied, teachers praise me when I have done well, are able to take responsibility, and have good access to games/indoor games/football league/sport

Areas for development, pupils think that these are the key areas for development-

Sports equipment/goals, Laptops – more required and School meals

School response – since this questionnaire was carried out, the new goals have been placed in the playgrounds. The school has a rolling programme of replacing and purchasing new laptops, budgets don't allow for us to purchase large quantities every year. The Pupil Council wrote to the head of catering services regarding school meals, all pupils have had the opportunity to complete a survey about school meals and some very good changes have already taken place, we will continue to work with our colleagues in the kitchen who have always been very responsive to pupils requests.

Parents reported that they:-

feel welcome in the school, pupil morale is high, pupil behaviour is high, pupils treated fairly and with respect, staff have high expectations, and school provides opportunities for pupils to take responsibility

Areas for development -there was one key area for development: improved links with the community

School response - we will have identified this as an area for development in the School Development Plan and will work hard with the Parent Forum to extend our work with the community. Last term we sent over 70 Christmas Parcels to the Blythewood Appeal, this year our Christmas and Easter Services will be held in St Magnus Cathedral. We will take every opportunity within the curriculum where possible to include extending our use of the local community.
