# More News

Norwegian Constitution Day 2008 This event takes place every year on 17 May, which this year falls on a Saturday.

In Norway it is celebrated as a national holiday and all the schools are closed and the children have special activities arranged for them. Here in Orkney we celebrate this day as part of our Twinning and Friendship agreement with the county of Hordaland in Norway, where the main city is Bergen.

Part of the day is taken up with a parade, called a "Tog" in Norwegian, and children join in the procession. There will be a "Tog" or parade on Saturday afternoon, made up of Norwegian visitors who have come here specially for this event, and other people from Orkney who like to join in. It will be led by Kirkwall City Pipe Band, and will leave the pierhead at 2.30 pm and make its way to St Magnus Cathedral where there will be some entertainment by some young Orcadian dancers and singers, plus the Kirkwall Town Band and Kirkwall City Pipe Band.

If you would like to join in with the parade with your family could you please join the others taking part who will gather for 2.15 pm at the area on Kirkwall pier just behind the offices of Orkney Ferries (near the zebra crossing close to Bridge Street).

# ARCTIC VOICE

On Thursday 29th May, Glenn Morris, leader of the Arctic Voice expedition through North West passage, will be visiting the school. He will talk to

## Sun Cream



Please remember to apply sun cream to your child before they come to school, and also provide a sun hat to keep harmful sun rays off delicate skin, t-shirts with short sleeves and collars are also a good idea. Children are encouraged to put on sun cream if you want to send it in, but please name sun cream and this should be handed into the class teacher. It is not necessary to fill in a medical form, but we are not allowed to share or put creams on other children unless verbal or written permission is given by parents and carers.
