Short Eared Owl

Brown and white patterned owl. Usually seen sitting on fence posts or flying over the moor.

Brown Hare

Long pointed ears, bigger than a rabbit. Seen running across fields.

8 points



Oyster Catcher

Black and white with long orange beak. Local name - Shalder.

4 points



Sky Lark

Small, brown bird. Often heard singing in sky.

10 points



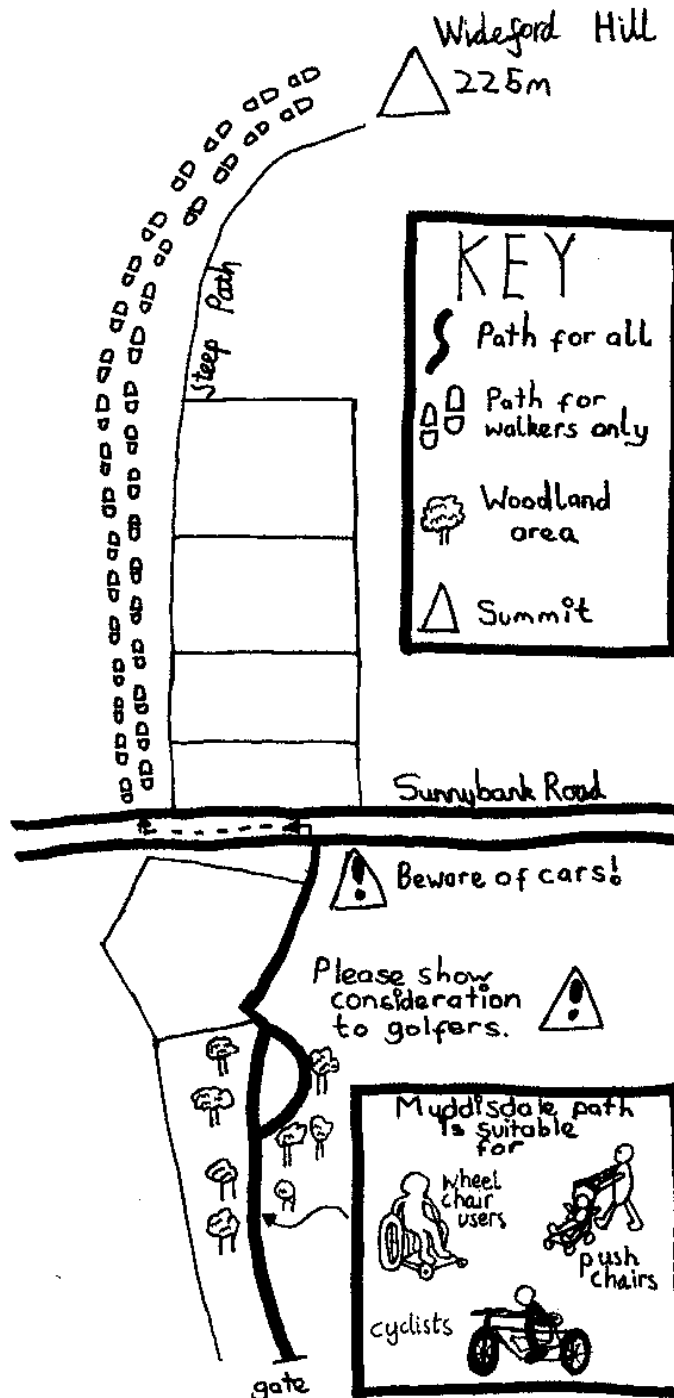
Hen Harrier

Female - large brown bird of prey.

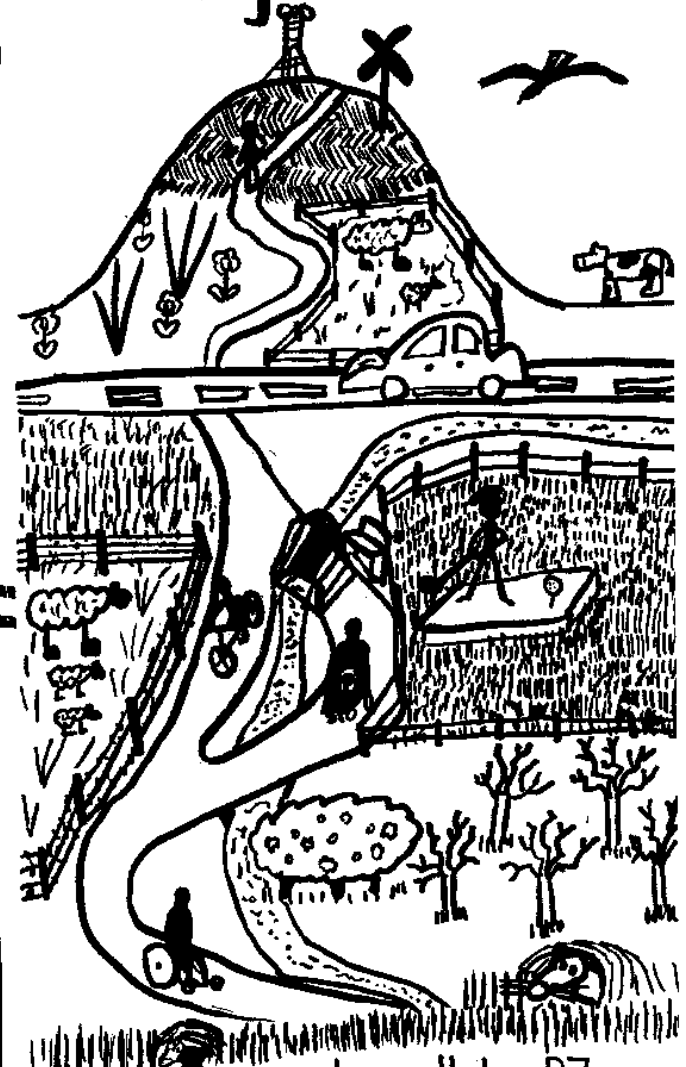
Male - Grey and white.

20 points

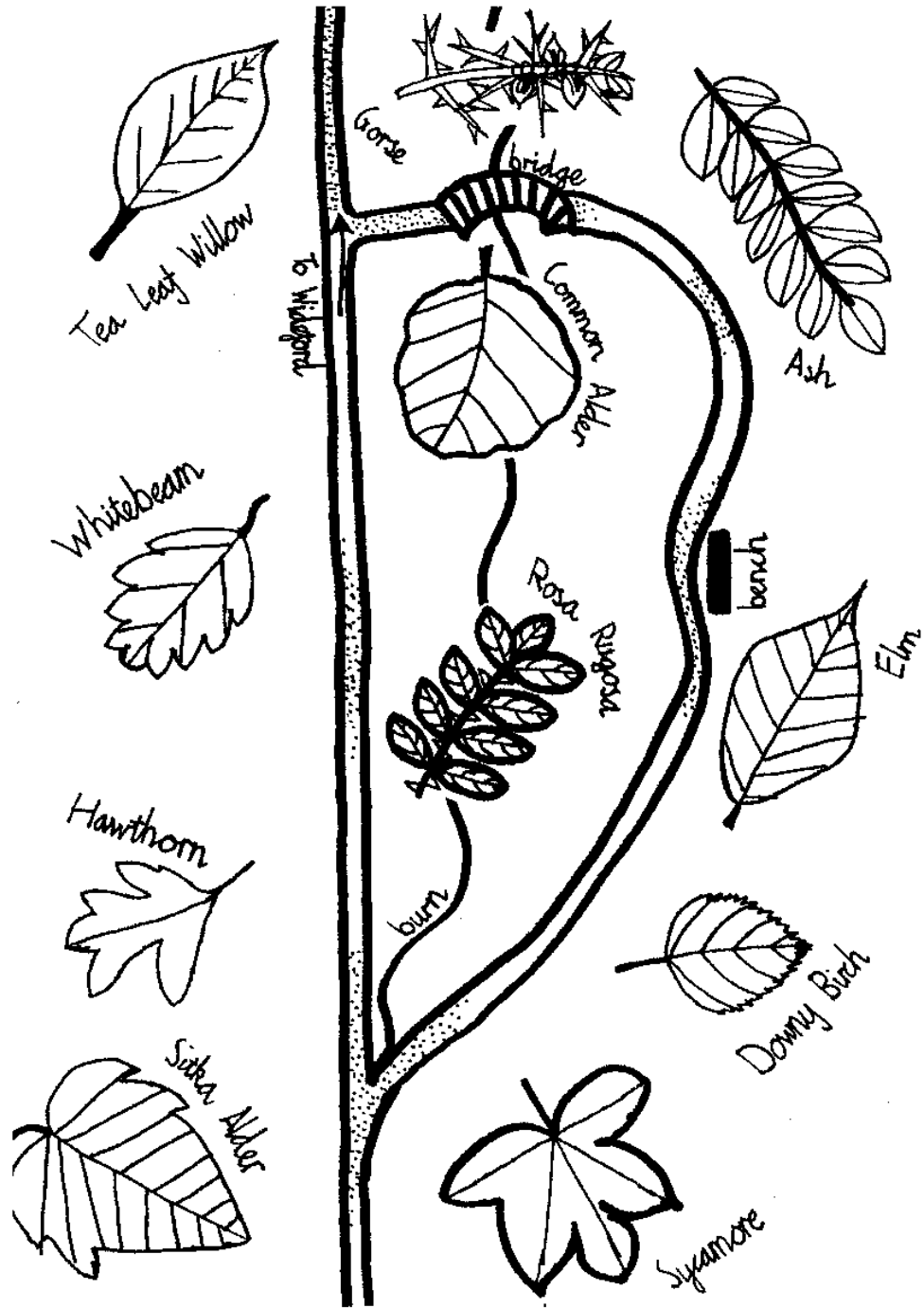
